Symbolic Play Test in Assessing Children's Early Language Skills

Purpose

- 1. To explore the early concept formation and symbolization, which precedes and develops alongside receptive and expressive verbal language
- 2. to know the level of a child's non-verbal symbolic thinking, which is independent of verbal comprehension and expression
- 3. Not intend to replace another developmental test
- 4. Can form the basis of remedial action and advice to the parents

Test Description

- Spontaneous non-verbal play activity in structured situation
- Test duration is short (10-15 minutes)
- Simple to administer
- Independent of verbal comprehension and expression
- Objective scoring system

Administration









Administration

- Free play
- Keep situation natural
- Draw attention to neglected toy
- No time limit
- Stop when child has indicated that he has finished; restless or bored











Research Findings of: Cross-Cultural Validation of Symbolic Play Test and Inter-Rater Agreement between Speech-Language Therapist and Nurses



There was a significant correlation between results of SPT and general quotient of GMDS-ER. Intraclass coefficient was 0.520, 95% CI 0.251 to 0.715 (p = < 0.001). N=39



Correlation between the results of SPT and the language component of GMDS-ER showed intraclass coefficient of -0.010, 95% CI -0.318 to 0.302 (p = 0.524). N=39

Conclusion

• In settings with poor resources, SPT can be an easy-touse tool for assessing young children's early concept formation and symbolization ability; as well as to identify those at risk of developmental delay.
